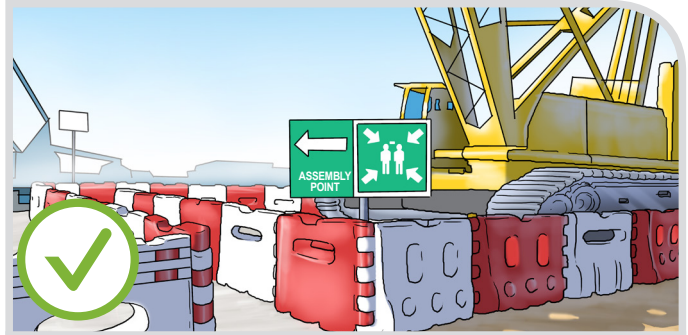




GOOD PRACTICES ✓



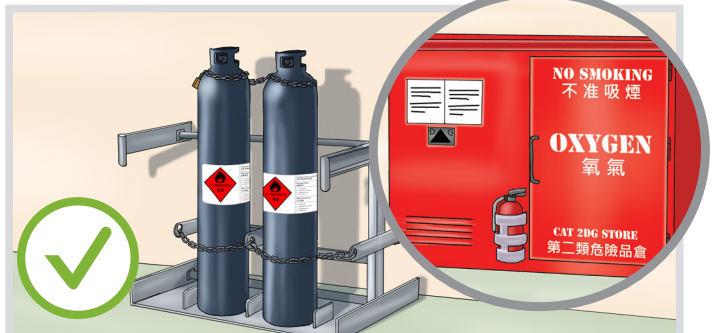
Keep all fire fighting equipment in safe working order, free from obstruction at all times and be so placed as to be readily available for use.



Provide clear directional signs to all emergency evacuation routes and keep all these routes free from obstruction at all times.



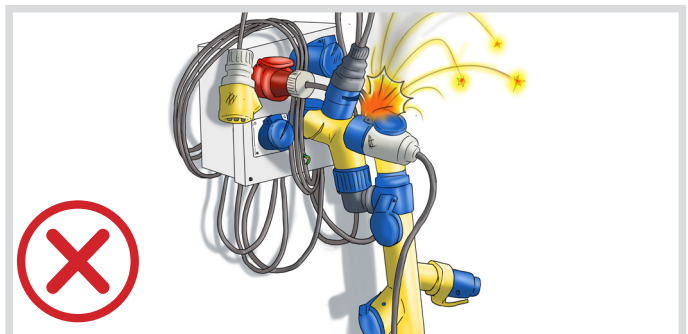
Obtain "Hot Work Permit" before conducting any hot work. Screen off all hot work and keep flammables away from all naked flame.



Store dangerous goods within their exempted quantities in licensed dangerous goods store to ensure safety.



Conduct regular fire drills to familiarise staff and workers with the emergency procedures, evacuation routes and assembly points.



Maintain all electrical equipment in safe condition at all times and avoid overloading them to prevent outbreak of fire.
