		(a) arrangements of CIC Apprenticeship Scheme without site trainer subsidy would remain unchanged;
		(b) addition of bonus for employers of CIC Apprenticeship Scheme and employers could be awarded HK\$10,000 for successful training of each skilled worker;
		 (c) the enhancement measures were applicable to the employers who successfully trained up qualified students on or after 1 May 2023;
		(d) the above-mentioned addition of bonus for employers would last for two years and be reviewed afterwards; and

		(e) the annual expenditure for the bonus for employers would be reserved in the mid-year budget review and annual budget.
2.6	CIC/CTB/P/015/23 (for approval)	Proposal on Subsidising "VTC Diploma of Vocational Education" in Years 2023/2024 to 2025/2026 and Referral of Advanced Diploma Graduates to Earn and Learn Scheme
		Members took note of Paper CIC/CTB/P/015/23, and approved the following suggestions on subsidising Diploma of Vocational Education and relevant financial expenditure:
		 (a) the programmes of Vocational Training Council (VTC) which duplicated with those of Hong Kong Institute of Construction (HKIC), including Diploma of Vocational Education (Electrical Engineering) and Diploma of Vocational Education (Mechanical Engineering) would no longer be subsidised;
		(b) the Advanced Diploma and Professional Diploma in Construction for Specialist Trades of HKIC had been recognised by the Qualifications Framework. Graduates could pursue further studies for degree programmes and employment directly. Therefore, the Advanced Diploma programmes proposed by VTC this year would not be subsidised;
		(c) subsidies for the programmes that did not overlap with those of HKIC, including Lift and Escalator Mechanic, Refrigeration, Air-Conditioning and Ventilation, Computer and Electronic Engineering and Gas Services Engineering, would be continued. As HKIC had no planning to allocate resources for commencing the training of the relevant trades in the coming years, the 3-year subsidising period (years 2023/24 to 2025/26) proposed by the VTC were regarded appropriate and the relevant arrangements also reduced

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		administrative work;
		(d) the last batch (September 2021 entry) of graduates of the Advanced Diploma programmes (graduated in 2023), which were not recognised by the Qualifications Framework, would be referred to join the Earn and Learn Scheme; and
		 (e) the number of subsidised training places in the three years from 2023/24 to 2025/26 was 1,305 and the total amount of subsidies was HK\$40,194,000 (HK\$30,800 x 435 places each year x 3 years). The estimated expenditure would be spent over 5 years from 2023 to 2027; and
		(f) The Executive Director would sign the agreements on behalf of CIC.

		Members took note of the progress on KPI of HKIC and Trade Testing.
		Foundation Certificate in Construction Safety (two-day Green Card Course)
		A Member opined that the two-day Green Card Course of HKIC was too long, and worried that it would be a burden to workers and might provoke a strong reaction among the workers. The Chairperson responded that the two-day Green Card Course could help increase the safety awareness of the workers, support from employers and the government was required to encourage workers to enroll. The coordination between various parties was required for the implementation of the two-day Green Card Course, policies should also be tied in with the Course. The Executive Director expressed that the two-day Green Card Course had been recognised by the Labour Department (LD). There were different elements involved in site safety and the Green Card Course was the threshold for the sites, therefore, it was particularly important to increase the safety awareness of the workers. The LD representative stated that LD was reviewing the content and class hours of the Green Card Course.
