Mercado Solutions Associates Ltd. (MSA) would conduct data collection and expert interviews from August to September 2016. As of 25 August 2016, there were 197 questionnaires returned. Data analysis and initial survey results will be formulated by October 2016. The draft Survey Report is targeted to be submitted for discussion and endorsement (if appropriate) in the next Com-ENV Meeting No. 004/16 scheduled on the 25 November 2016.  Members of Com-ENV were delighted to hear about the good response rate regarding the questionnaire.
