		Members were informed that the Business Plan and Budget allocation for 2025 had been approved by the Council. The budget for Com-E&S in 2025 would be HK\$7,590,000.
		(b) <u>AOB item – Technical Procurement Guideline by Hong Kong PropTech Alliance / RESET Carbon</u>
		Members were informed that it was PropTech Alliance that launched the Technical Procurement Guideline, and that RESET Carbon was the Technical Partner. The Co-Chair of the PropTech Alliance and representatives from RESET Carbon joined a CIC webinar in mid-November to introduce the Guideline.

	(for approval)	Members were informed that the SWMT development had been completed and was in operation, while the Material Exchange (MEx) Platform was under development.
		Members suggested exploring the possibility of enhancing data input automation in future SWMT development. Further follow up with the Environment Protection Department on integration with C·Easy System and expedition of account setup for outstanding projects were also suggested

		Regarding the study for reduction of timber and timber formwork, members suggested reviewing the focus of the report – which should include, amongst others (a) reducing the use of timber in temporary formwork; (b) enhancing recycling of used timber formwork; and (c) exploring alternatives to timber veneer as finishing materials. Members suggested renaming MEx Platform to facilitate future promotion of the platform. Members approved the release of the final payment of HK\$186,000 for the development of the SWMT.
4.5	CIC/E&S/P/016/24 (for approval)	Revision to the User Guide and Technical Requirements for the CIC Sustainable Finance Certification Scheme Members were briefed on the proposed revision to the User Guide and Technical Requirements of the CIC Sustainable Finance Certification Scheme (SFCS) to align with the latest international sustainable finance-related standards. Members noted the progress update on the stakeholder engagement of the SFCS's enhancement and reposition study will be made in the next Com-E&S meeting. Members approved the proposed revisions to the CIC SFCS User Guide and Technical Requirements.

In addition, it is suggested to look into the early availability of electricity supply which may hinder wide adoption of electric-powered plants and equipment at construction sites.
		Members suggested that the study should provide practical advice and focus on suggestions for the mid-term development for the next 3 to 5 years. The consultant will include the above aspects in the recommendation report.

Members suggested organising a formal Launching Ceremony for the platform and advised to promote the iBEAM Unison at the Digital Twin Hub and arrange workshops at the Center for Future Construction if possible. The CIC Secretariat will further discuss with the BSL regarding the promotion details. Members proposed the BSL to validate the setting in the solar radiation calculation function of the system. The BSL reported that the solar radiation calculation function will be further validated with 3rd party software if necessary. BSL will also strive to get the platform for BEAM Plus recognition with the standard committee. Members were invited to experience the platform with a trial account.
