Key Highlights

A total of 52 industry representatives participated in the technical visits, with an overall satisfaction rate of 98%.
- 3. The MLS Department plans to organise a BIM Information Technology Application and Innovation Seminar in March. The upcoming technical visits will focus on Robotics, Artificial Intelligence, and Low-Altitude Economy in the Greater Bay Area in May and the East China region in June. The 6th National Affairs for Hong Kong Construction Industry course will be held in Beijing in June.
