**6.19 Confirmation of Minutes of the Previous Meeting
(Open-door Session)**

Members referred to Paper CIC/CMT/M/005/25 and confirmed the minutes of the open-door session of the 5th meeting of 2025 held on Friday, 17 October 2025 at the Board Room, 29/F, Tower 2, Enterprise Square Five (MegaBox), 38 Wang Chiu Road, Kowloon Bay, Kowloon, Hong Kong.

**6.20 Matters Arising from the Previous Meeting
(Open-door Session)**

Item 5.27 Regarding the Scholarship for Family Members of Registered Construction Workers Award, in response to the Chairman's enquiry about the possibility of increasing the number of scholarship recipients, according to the CWRB Secretariat, the number of awards for students taking construction-related subjects would be increased to highlight the significance of attracting new blood to the construction industry.

6.21 Summary Notes of 3rd Meeting of Committee on Building Information Modelling and Construction Digitalisation for 2025

Invited by the Chairman, JCCp provided Members with a brief update on the BIM and Construction Digitalisation Survey 2025, noting that the final report was scheduled for submission to the Committee on Building Information Modelling and Construction Digitalisation (Com-BIM&CD) for approval and release in December 2025.

JCCp continued that the “Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macau

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BIM Competition 2025” attracted applications from 64 public and private sectors projects and 13 teams of students from local institutions.

6.24 Summary Notes of 5th Meeting of Committee on Registered Specialist Trade Contractors Scheme for 2025

Invited by the Chairman, ETg reported that the Com-RSC had, in principle, approved the upgrading of the existing trade “Site Lifting Operations” to a designated specialist trade (S22) under the registration scheme. The Com-RSC Secretariat would organise a briefing session in early January 2026 to explain the regulatory scope, registration requirements and transitional arrangements, etc. prior to re-confirming the target implementation date.

Following the Tai Po fire incident, the Chairman emphasised the need to strengthen promotional efforts and encourage RMAA contractors to register under the designated trades of ‘Building Maintenance’ (S13) and ‘Interior Fitting-out’ (S14), aiming to curb the unethical practices by a minority of operators and uphold the integrity of the construction industry.

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MCh proposed promoting the existing RMAA - registered specialist trade contractors directory - to the public as a trusted source of professional contractors. This move would help establish a recognised premium brand and attract reputable RMAA contractors to join the scheme.

PSW expressed appreciation for CIC’s prompt response for issuing a statement on 12 December 2025, noting that the Committee on Repair, Maintenance, Alteration and Addition (Com-RMAA) would conduct a review to strengthen industry ethics, enhance safety and professional training, and raise standards across six key areas: “Safety”, “Management”, “Job Experience”, “Execution”, “Finance” and “Integrity Management”. These measures were intended to establish a reliable and accountable team of contractors. PSW stated that the Com-RMAA should take lead to coordinate relevant tasks across different Committees. The Chairman shared PSW’s view and requested ETg and TLG to develop a holistic roadmap to facilitate the implementation of RMAA initiatives.

6.26 Summary Notes of 4th Meeting of Construction Workers Registration Board for 2025

Invited by the Chairman, LN reported that the Construction Workers Carnival and the inaugural “Outstanding Frontline Supervisor Award” were successfully held on 16 November 2025, attracting over 6,300 frontline practitioners and their families. LN highlighted that the award represented an important recognition of outstanding practitioners and

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recommended sustained efforts to further strengthen this initiative. In addition, the tea gathering activities with registered workers and their families provided a valuable opportunity to enhance engagement, foster stronger relationships and promote a positive image of the construction industry.

Regarding the initiative to establish a dedicated platform for reconnecting with past awardees of the Scholarship for Family Members of Registered Construction Workers and inviting them to share their success stories with the younger generation, the CWRB Secretariat was currently attempting to reach out to past awardees to confirm their interest in joining the network.
