Committee on Building Information Modelling and Construction Digitalisation
Summary of Meeting No. 003/25

Key Highlights

1. For the progress update on BIM and Construction Digitalisation Survey 2025, Members expressed their opinions on the preliminary findings on different aspects including BIM adoption experience, BIM uses and benefits, hurdles to BIM adoption, drivers of BIM adoption, BIM personnel demand and supply analysis, and policy recommendation. Arcadis will incorporate these comments into the Final Report. The Final Report is targeted to be submitted to Com-BIM & CD for final review and approval in December 2025.
2. For progress update on BIM Diversification, the “Launching of BIM Diversification Week” on 25 August 2025 was highlighted and Members were informed that diversified BIM software webinars and workshops were arranged for industry practitioners to enhance their understanding.
3. The “Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macau BIM Competition 2025” (2025年粵港澳第一屆 BIM 應用大賽) was presented to Members to encourage participation. A total of 64 projects from both public and private sectors, as well as 13 student teams from local institutions, have submitted applications for the competition.
4. Members were introduced the BIM Training Roadmap 2026 & 2027 from the progress update of the Task Force on BIM and CD Training. DEVB expressed support for the roadmap and aimed to develop a comprehensive strategy to enhance BIM training and promote industry collaboration.
5. Members were briefed on the proposed CIC KPI in 2026:
 - Develop and publish comprehensive reference materials on BIM Diversification by Q1 2026, showcasing advanced and emerging BIM applications across the construction lifecycle to promote broader industry awareness, adoption, and capability uplift. It is targeted to facilitate the awareness of BIM Diversification to 2,000 BIM practitioners.
 - Deliver an award and conference event by Q3 2026, spotlighting transformative technologies in Artificial Intelligence (AI), Robotics, and the Low Altitude Economy, engaging a total of 8,000 in-person and online participants.
6. Members were advised that the CIC plans to support the Government's push to promote AI among clients, consultants, contractors, and subcontractors starting in 2026.

Members expressed the need for granular data analysis, clearer categorisation of hurdles and drivers, and tailored strategies to accelerate BIM adoption, and these inputs should shape the roadmap on training and policy.
