		(a) Autodesk discount in subscription fees	
		Mr. Alex HO, Senior Manager-BIM, updated Members on Autodesk's special discount on their software licences (for the whole industry in Hong Kong) after meeting with Autodesk Hong Kong representatives on 14 December 2020. The CIC would send the details of Autodesk's responses on the questions raised by Members and invite Members to attend the online sessions on Revit's roadmap. Autodesk had indicated to the CIC that they would acknowledge the effort from the CIC and the industry in reflecting industry's concerns on the cost of software licences, and on issues related to change from network licences to individual licences, and as a result of the communication they had responded by providing special discounts on their software licences.

		(b) Research projects "BIM-based Rebar Design Optimisation and Prefabrication Automation"	
		Mr. Thomas CHAN supplemented that the DEVB had identified some pilot projects for trial use of BIM technology for rebar prefabrication, and they would advise Works Departments to use the plug-in software. Mr. Macin KLOCEK indicated that he would also try to identify pilot MTR projects for use of the software developed.

The Project Working Group and Project Steering Group would review the details and discuss the matter further in a separate meeting.

Ada FUNG reported that the Hong Kong Alliance of Built Asset & Environment Information Management Association (i.e. the Hong Kong Chapter of buildingSMART International) would launch the BuildingSMART Professional Certification Program for openBIM training and certification in 2021.  (b) Updates on DEVB Technical Circular (Works) on BIM  Mr. Thomas CHAN reported that the updated DEVB Technical Circular (Works) on BIM would be issued in December 2020 and would take effect on 1 January 2021. The Circular would enhance the intellegentation requirements for BIM adoption and extend the scene of
		would enhance the implementation requirements for BIM adoption and extend the scope of mandatory BIM uses. The Circular would also emphasize on re-engineering the workflow for the whole project delivery cycle to make good use of the BIM data/model, mention the aim to adopt BIM for e-tendering, stipulate that the BIM Team Leader shall be a CIC-Certified BIM Manager and recognise the CIC-Certified BIM Coordinator as an acceptable qualification for the BIM Coordinators specified. In addition, BIM Key Performance Indicators would be introduced and data would be collected to measure the effectiveness of BIM adoption for continuous improvement.
