

CIC Safety Message No. 009 / 21

Industrial accident (July 2021)

An accident happened on 6 July 2021 on a construction site in Fanling, in which a worker was suspected struck by a fallen metal I-beam being dismantled at a trench. He was certified dead later in the hospital.

▶ As a Contractor / Subcontractor / Employer:

- Appoint a competent person to conduct task-specific risk assessments to identify all potential hazards associated with the work, taking into account the nature of work and the working environment;
- 2. Formulate appropriate safe work methods and procedures, detailing the methods and sequences in each stage of alteration and dismantling; the plant and equipment to be used;
- 3. Ensure that the alteration / dismantling works are carried out by trained workmen with adequate experience under the immediate supervision of a supervisor; and
- 4. Provide all personnel concerned with the necessary safety information, instruction and training, and ensuring that they are familiar with the safe work procedures and safety measures.

► As a Frontline Supervisor / Worker:

- 1. Ensure the alteration/dismantling works are carried out in strict accordance with the method statement, safety procedures and safety measures;
- 2. Implement an effective monitoring and control system to ensure all safety measures are strictly followed by workers; and
- 3. Establish a danger zone for alteration / dismantling works to avoid unauthorized entry in to the zone.

As a Safety Practitioner:

- Conduct a comprehensive risk assessment on the relevant procedures of alteration and dismantling, propose risk control measures to eliminate the hazards:
- 2. Provide safety training to relevant personnel and workers; and
- 3. Develop and implement an effective, proactive inspection programme to ensure that safety measures are strictly followed, and to report any non-compliances.

The above only listed out key points of safety, for more information please make reference to the *Construction Sites (Safety) Regulations*, *the Safe System of Work* and *5 Steps to Risk Assessment* issued by the Labour Department.
