The Ceremony was officiated by Mr. Michael WONG Wai-lun, Secretary for Development and Ir LAM Sai-hung, Permanent Secretary for Development (Works), HKSAR in the morning and afternoon sessions respectively. About 550 people attended the Ceremony today, including graduates and their families, as well as guests from the construction industry.

Prof. LEE Chack-fan, Chairman of Hong Kong Institute of Construction Management Board encouraged graduates to work conscientiously and persistently as they will definitely get recognition eventually.
